**[18 June 2009, SINGAPORE]** This Friday and the next, head down to the Asian Civilisations Museum (ACM) to party with one of China's greatest emperors! On 19 and 26 June, the museum will stay open till midnight for **Late Night Fridays @ ACM**, with free admission from 5pm onwards. Visitors can catch the blockbuster exhibition **The Kangxi Emperor: Treasures from the Forbidden City** and enjoy a host of festivities, including a spectacular 3D light show that will see the museum's façade transformed into a thrilling canvas of lights and moving images on 19 June, created and sponsored by Glorious Pte Ltd.

### **The Kangxi Emperor: Treasures from the Forbidden City**

13 March - 28 June 2009

Hailed as one of China's greatest emperors, the Kangxi Emperor, XuanYe, succeeded his father, Emperor Shunzhi, at the tender age of eight. During his reign (1662 – 1722), the Manchus consolidated rule over China and the Chinese empire expanded.

The Kangxi Emperor's many achievements can be attributed to his passion and competence in his various roles. He was an astute ruler, skilled warrior, keen scholar and patron of the arts. His intellect, political acumen, diverse talents and civic virtues won him the admiration and support of his subjects.

This exhibition showcases treasures from the Palace Museum, Beijing and offers visitors a rare glimpse into the Forbidden City - right here in Singapore.
