

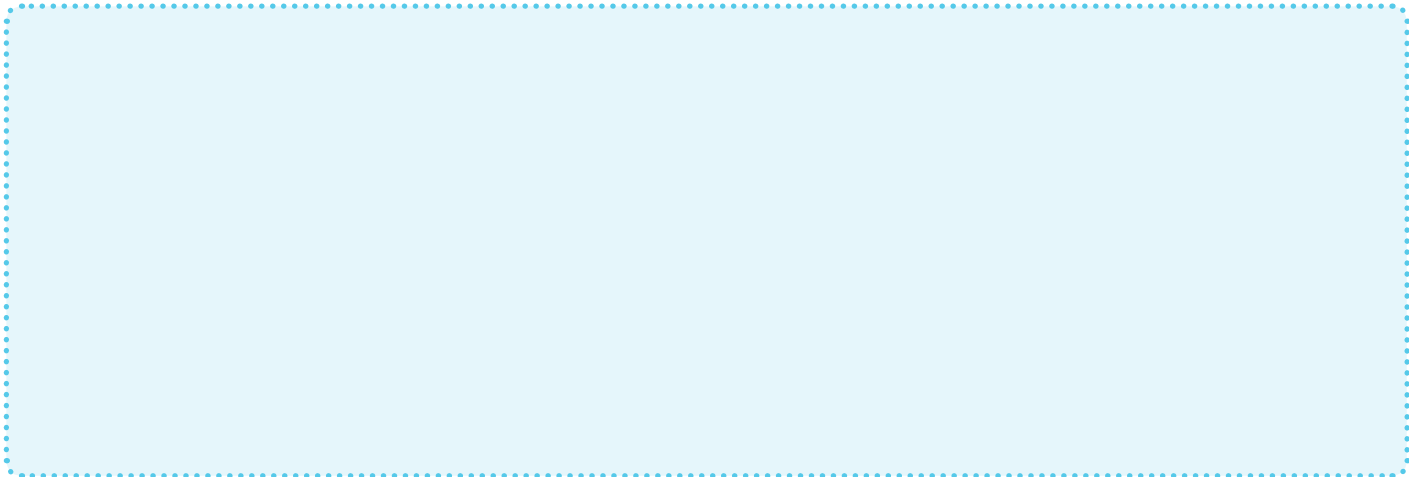

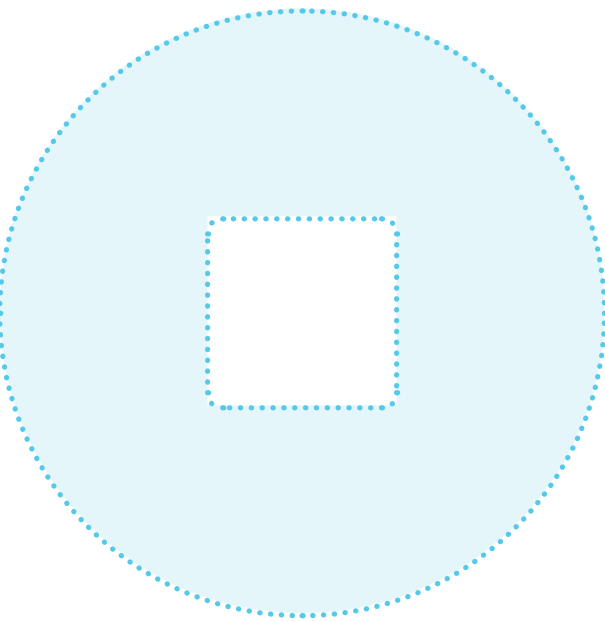
This Majapahit-style horse and rider statue is possibly made in Java, Indonesia, but excavated in Singapore. **WHAT** do you think this object was used for?

ARCHAEOLOGISTS discovered objects left behind by people who lived about 700 years ago. These objects were found underground and underwater.

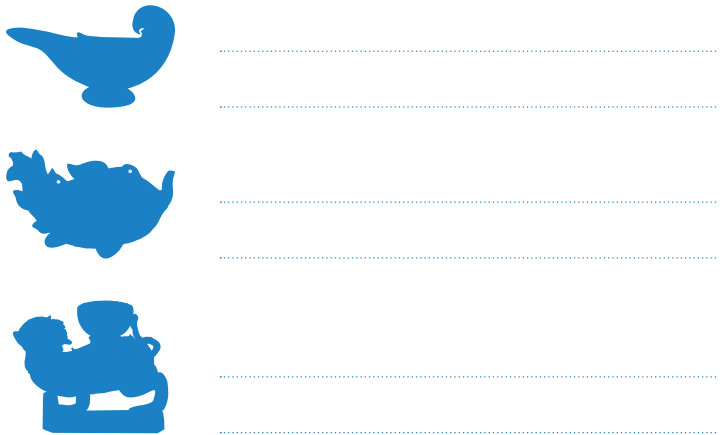
Meet this figurine from Vietnam
